Airplanes Carrying 100 Holiday Makers Are Engineering Realities, Aeronautics Expert

Airplanes capable of carrying 100 passengers on special week-end cruises to the North Pole and seven-day trips around the world were engineering realities, said Ignor I. Sikorsky, noted aeronautical engineer, in Toronto last month.

Speaking before the Affiliated Engineering and Allied Societies in Ontario, the designer of many successful types of airplanes said plans had been completed for 100ton "clipper" ships and manufacturers could guarantee their performance.

Larger Planes Successful He told the meeting it had been discovered larger airplanes gained efficiency rather than lost it beeause of size. He said large flying boats were the most successful and

most effective 'planes of today. These machines would travel between Quebec and England in 14 to 16 hours, providing the same passenger comforts as modern ocean liners, he said.

If you have an idea auctioneering technique, including the singsong comes naturally, listen to Fred Reppert.

"Auctioneers," Reppert said sternly, "are made-not born." How Do They Do It?

Registered livestock is also sold slower to permit the auctioneer to build up each animal's show re cords, pedigree, merits and produc-



Farm Forum ******

Conducted by Profesor Henry G. Bell of the Ontario Agricultural College, Guelph, with the cooperation of the staff of the O.A.C.

Q .- I have not been sowing any commercial fertilizer with grain and while I am getting crops the equal of any of my friends who do, I feel that could I obtain a fertilizer that would stiffen straw it would be of advantage. While grain does not lodge badly, I think a small amount of fertilizer of the nature to stiffen straw would improve sample and perhaps the yield. I recognize the fact that 125 lbs. per acre of the usual fertilizer would stiffen the straw as desired but would not increase yield sufficiently to offset the cost. Twenty-five lbs. per acre of the proper ingredient should, I think, do the trick. I would like your opinion and as to best available information re this matter .-W.M.H., Wellington County.

A .- The elements that have to do with strength of straw appear to be Calcium and Potash, hence it is that we find a judicious amount of Phosphated Potash Fertilizer usually results in giving a stronger straw with an earlier and more even crop than where no fertilizer had been applied. Naturally we could make suggestions more to the point if we had a sample of your soil, but I presume that you practise a good crop rotation and apparently use considerable manure. formation in regard to sowing salt on land. I am dealing in salt this spring and quite a few farmers bought salt to put on land. Others are inquiring about it. I have had no experience with it whatever. If you can tell me how to sow and what it is supposed to do, I would have something to show. -A.B., Oxford County.

A .- In answer to yours of the 19th, I would say that we do not advise the use of Salt as an application to the soil. Salt does not supply any plant food whatsoever. All it does is to liberate a certain amount of Potash, hence the continuous use of Salt simply means the impoverishment of soil. Some farmers have used it on mangels with some results, but there is no logical reason for its use, and we do not advise it.
