deaux as this material is not only a valuable fungicide but repe's the attacks of destructive insects like the flea beetle and leafhopper. Two or three applications in a season should give sufficient protection from all insects when applied thoroughly and at a time when the new damage first becomes evident. In spraying, cover both the upper and lower surfaces of the leaves and use an abund ance of material. When the plants are small, 50 to 75 gallons per acre, and when fully grown 100 to 120 gallong per acre is not too much at each application. -Dominion Dept of Agriculture bulletin.
