#### Sheep Flocks Yield Profits

Dr. G. I. Christie Advises The Raising of Them as Sideline

Farm flocks, while not "large money-makers" are proving a satisfactory part of a "good farm plan," the Ontario Sheep Breeders Assocfation was told by Dr. G. I. Christie the president of the Ontario Agricultural College.

Only Reasonable Care Needed "Farmers with locks of 12 to 15 ewes are showing a net profit of \$160 to \$175 per year and have a profitable sideline." Dr. Christie said, "These sheep require only reasonable care and can be kept on the ordinary farm feeds. More Ontario farmers can well afford to keep a small flock of good commercial sheep."

Dr. Christie said that a recent survey showed the average number of ewes on farms in Central and Western Ontario was 12.2 and the average number of lambs 17.3. The average lamb price was \$7.53 and the average gross income per ewe. with lamb and wool included,

#### Save Resources, Canada Advised

Dr. H. A. Morgan, TVA Head, Urges Citizens of Dominion Become Aware of the Need For Conservation

Canada's future is imperilled untess its citizens reconcile their individual interests with the conservation of the country's natural resources, Dr. Harcourt A. Morgan, chairman of the Tennessee Valley Authority, said at the annual convocation exercises of University of Western Ontario.

A native of Strathroy, Ont., and a graduate of University of Toronto, Dr. Morgan was admitted to the honorary degree of Doctor of Laws.

Dr. Morgan said that when he finished college a half-century ago, "we felt like well-armed soldiers who should become lords of the earth." Today the situation has changed and "we hope to become good tenants, tolerant of the conditions in which we find ourselves but determined that they will be immeasurably improved when the term of our lease expires."

### Keeping Pasture Herbage Edible

Close Grazing to Prevent Coarse Growth Is Essen-

In order to keep pasture herb age in as palatable and nutritious a condition as possible, close grazing to prevent coarse growth is essential. Under eastern climatic conditions the rate of growth of pasture herbers is not uniform throughou' the growing season. Following a rapid rate of growth from early Spring to about the middle of June, there is usually decided decline and relatively slow growth through midsummer, with a slight recovery in the early Fall. The method of securing optimum utilization of herbage under these conditions depends on the number of stock carried. Where there is insufficient stock to graze the Spring growth of herbage uniformly, mowing the pasture is advisable to prevent a coarse stand of mature plants. Mowing when the grasses are just heading out will promote an aftermath of tender, nutritious herbage. Live stock will consume the mown grass if it '3 left lying on the field, although they do not relish this coarse material before it is cut.
