

Is The Corset Here To Stay?

Situation "Hasn't Quite Congealed Yet," Says Mainbocher, Fashion Expert, Who Reviewed It

The corset situation, which has had all the girls in a breathless dither since August "hasn't quite congealed yet" it seems. But it will.

That was the latest word last week on the question which has provoked the biggest style controversy since skirts first journeyed knee-high after swishing for years around the ankles.

It came from Mainbocher, the designer who created the Duchess of Windsor's wedding gown, and who found himself unwittingly in the limelight last August when he showed a pink satin, back-lace corset that started a trend on both sides of the Atlantic.

The Long-Ribbed Look
"One reason why the corset is here to stay, in one form or another," said Mainbocher, "is that it enables a woman to look young without wearing a 'Baby Snooks' dress."

When a style "congeals" in his opinion, it settles down, takes a final form, becomes an integral part of women's lives. His return to the corsetted silhouette in designing was never a stunt, he said, and he never intended it to be an instrument of torture.

"What I hoped it would give was the long-ribbed look which young American girls possess naturally."

A Liquid Diet For Clear Skin

Blemishes Melt With Lots of Sleep and 24-Hour Diet of Liquids

Rapid-fire cure for the lumps, bumps and blemished which sometimes show up on the skin after a period of little sleep and a great deal of over-eating consists of sticking to a liquid diet for twenty-four hours and getting 10 hours of sleep for three consecutive nights.

The next time you notice that your complexion is covered with little blemishes, resolve then and there to take no nourishment other than liquids for the following twenty-four hours.

The Diet
Begin your liquid-diet-day by drinking a glass of hot water with a dash of fresh lemon juice. At least half an hour later, have a large glass of fruit or vegetable juice and a hot beverage instead of a regular breakfast of solid food.

During the morning, drink a big glass of milk or a cup of clear soup or more fruit or vegetable juice. Lunch may consist of fruit juice and soup and milk. Be sure to drink several glasses of water between meals.

Skip Desserts
By the middle of the afternoon, you'll want another glass of milk or fruit juice. For dinner, you will undoubtedly want a great deal of food. However, hungry or not, just stick to liquids only, then go to bed early and put out the light in time to allow for 10 hours of sleep.

Bread and Gravy

A plea that etiquette authorities lift the social ban on sopping—the custom of soaking up gravy and juices with bread—was made last week by the American Bakers' Association. Future Depends On Welfare Of Today's Children

Dr. Alan Roy Dafeo Addresses Forum on Current World Problems — "Citizens of Tomorrow"

The "increasingly problematic future" of what is becoming an "increasingly complex civilization" depends upon the health of today's children, Dr. Alan Roy Dafeo told the forum on current world problems sponsored by the New York Herald Tribune.

The citizens of tomorrow, are the children of today, said the famous "country doctor" who has had the care of the Dionne Quintuplets since their birth 5½ years ago. And since the fundamental requirement of a good citizen is good health it is essential that greater care be taken in safeguarding the physical, mental and emotional development of children.

Make Them Independent

He outlined several points to be kept in mind. Children should be born healthy; through the physical fitness of parents and particularly the mother at the time of birth; children should be assured a natural diet of mother's milk; children ought not to be spoiled but should be encouraged to "stand on their own feet"; children should not be exposed to domestic quarrels and scenes.

Parents, added Dr. Dafeo, ought to bring up their child in a way that he or she will ultimately be completely independent of them; for only when a son or a daughter can do this is he or she a full-fledged independent human being—a better citizen.

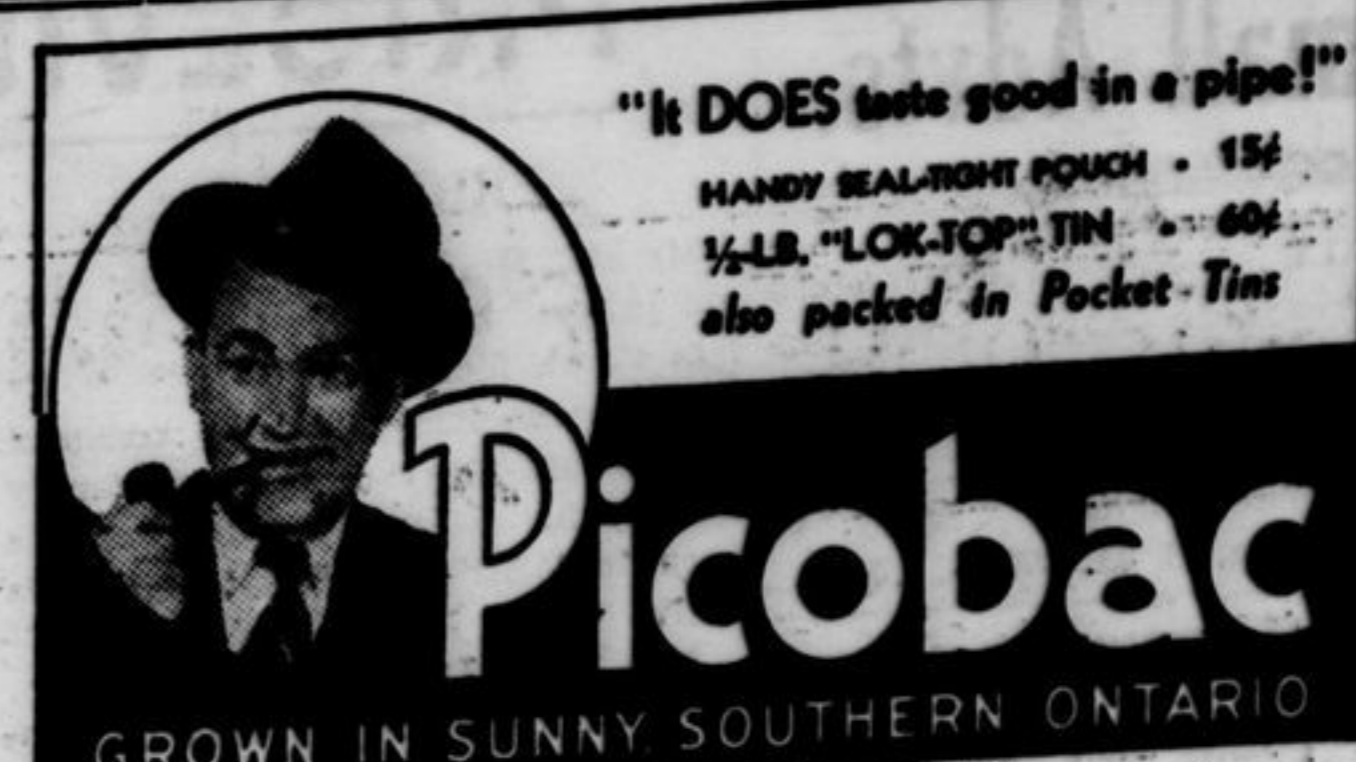
Incidentally, any old pairs of chamois leather gloves make lovely linings for cosies.

Any loose ends or pulled threads should be clipped off even with the pile—never pulled. A firm, tight underweave, close even pile, firm selvages and well-finished hems should be assurance of long-wearing towels.

Desserts That Are Different

Every household has its favorite desserts, as well as other weekly dishes regularly served, but everyone now and then longs for a change or something different in regular routine. One must not desert one's ambition for new desserts. Try these tested recipes and I am sure they will be social-ly registered as permanents with your family.

GINGER-NUT RICE

½ cup rice
2 quarts boiling water
1 teaspoon salt
1 quart cold water
2 cups chopped candied ginger
and syrup
½ cup marshmallows cut in small pieces
½ cup pecan nuts
2/3 cup fruit sugar
¼ teaspoon salt
Add rice to boiling water with salt; cook until tender about 40 min. To preserve shape of rice be sure and not have it overcooked. Drain; rinse with cold water and place in cool place until ready to serve. Have ready ginger syrup (made by chopping ½ cup candied ginger covered with 2 cups water and ½ cup sugar; boil these ingredients together 20 minutes), add to rice; also marshmallows which have been cut fine. Lastly fold in stiffly beaten cream and chopped nuts. Serve in sherbet glasses and top with cherry.

DATE PUDDING

4 tablespoons butter
½ cup corn syrup
½ cup milk
½ cup brown sugar
¼ teaspoon soda
¼ teaspoon salt
1 egg
¼ teaspoon cloves
¼ teaspoon allspice
¾ teaspoon nutmeg
1½ flour
½ lb. dates stoned and cut fine
Melt the butter, add the well beaten egg, milk and molasses. Add the dry ingredients, which have been sifted together and lastly add the dates. Steam for 2½ hours and serve with sugar sauce. Serves 6.

SUGAR SAUCE

1 tablespoon of corn syrup
1 cup brown sugar
3 (level) tablespoons flour
2 cups boiling water
3 tablespoons butter
1 teaspoon vanilla
Mix sugar and flour very thoroughly (which is the secret if this sauce is to be successful). Add boiling water and cook until there is no taste of starch (raw). Beat in corn syrup, remove from the fire and add butter and vanilla.

APPLE DREAM

1 package strawberry flavored jelly powder
1 pint boiling water
1 large red apple or 2 small ones
10 marshmallows
1 cup whipped cream
Place jelly powder in bowl, add boiling water, stir and mix very thoroughly. Grate the apple,

which must be grated fine when jelly mixture is about lukewarm; add the apple. When the mixture is quite thick, almost set, add the marshmallows, gently pushing them under the mixture. Chill and serve with topping of whipped cream.
