Militia Will Get Wider Training

War and the demands of the Canadian Active Service Force will lead to an enlargement of the summer training program of the non-permanent active militia in 1940.

Generally the militia units not alread; mobilized into the active service force will carry out a greater training program than in peacetime and one more calculated to fit their members to become specialists in the active service force, if and when required.

Thus, at training camps all across Canada next summer the militiamen will learn more of arti-gas procedure, and anti-aircraft gunnery and field-craft training than in other years and less of ceremonial drill.

There will be less leg-work and more lectures, less shouldering of arms and more shouldering of shovels less marching in step and more creeping through the grass.

With the formation of the active service force many units in the nonpermanent militia were asked to turn in some of the equipment, including rifles, uniforms and camp equipment. In the early weeks of the war every item in some lines of equipwas needed for the use of units moblized in two divisions and then recruiting up to war strength.

New the active service force units are being issued new equipment and by the time the non-permanent units go to camp next summer they will have ample stores of equipment for the number of men they will be authorized to train.
