

The "hey-hey-hi-de-ho" days of youth are the ones we always remember and as snapshots at night are so easy to take why not start in right now and make picture records of the many happy winter evenings at home. All you need are three or four photoffood lamps for brilliant illumination and a camera with an 1.6.3 lens, or faster. Photoflood lamps cost only twenty-five cents each and as they are good for two hours of picture taking, the cost per picture is negligible.
