Drivers Blamed In Car-Train Crashes

Motorists' Disregard of Stop Signal and Crossing in Front of the Engine Accounted for 25 Per Cent. of Such Acci-

Over 43 per cent of motorists involved in accidents with trains at level crossings in the first six months of last year drove over the crossings while warning belts were ringing and wigwag signals waving, according to a recent report of the Dominion Board of Transport Commissioners.

A total of 546 accidents was reported for the period under review, 434 on Canadian Pacific Railway crossings and 112 on crossings of the Canadian National Railways.

Through Sheer Recklessness Disregarding the stop signal and crossing in front of the engine or train accounted for over 25 per cent of the mishaps, the report continues. The next highest percentage of motorists, 7.3, crossed in front of trains switching or backing over crossings. Others drove under crossing gates, failed to look before crossing and were guilty of various other errors of omission or commission.

Thatcher advises this method of pursuit, but you might try it first on an old clothesline:

"Step alongside the running snake, which has its head close to the ground, and swing the arm down to seize the snake close behind the head. If a person misses, the arm can readily and speedily continue its swing."

He did not recommend this style of rattler "bulldogging" for snakes over three feet in length and, after thinking it over, advised tenderfeet the "wisest procedure for those unfamiliar with reptiles is to avoid handling rattlesnakes under any circumstances."





HEALTH **TOPICS**

DON'T OVERDO EXERCISE Too much emphasis is placed on exercise as a health factor, Dr. William O'Brien, director of post-gradnate medical education at the Uni-

versity of Minnesota believes. Exercise is beneficial in small doses but there is danger in overdoses. "If you feel in the mood for exercise, the best thing to do is sit down and rest until the mood has passed," he said.

After the 40th birthday more rest and a firmer check on bad habits is necessary, he declared, because the body cannot stand so much punishment.

DIET FOR COLDS Complete immunity to infectious cannot be brought about by dietary means, and with many diseases nutrition has no effect, but a tremendous amount can be done to keep resistance at a high level by

proper nutrition. It has been found that a deficiency of any of the necessary food elements tends to increase susceptibility to infections. The foods to emphasize are milk, cheese, eggs, fruits, and vegetables. If you are susceptible to colds take some source of Vitamin D.

Field Crop Value Climbed in 1939

\$634,130,000 in Past Year Was Canada's Best for Nearly Decade - 15 Per Cent Over 1938

Gross vame to Canadian farmers of field crops harvested in 1939 was \$634,130,000, some \$84,061,000 more than in 1938, the Dominion Bureau of Statistics reported in its third estimate of 1939 yields. The revised 1939 figure an in-

crease of 15 per cent. over 1938 was the highest since 1930 when the valuation was \$662,040,900. Valuation of last year's produc-

tion, however, ranked far below 1919 because high prices for the field crops at that time set an alltime top of \$1,237,169,000. Lower farm prices in many instances in 1939 offset increased production in many lines. Value of the 1939 wheat crop,

now estimated at 489,623,000 bushels, was placed at \$252,779,000, an increase of \$41,514,000 from 1938. Easier prices offset some of the production boost.

Coarse grain prices, however, were better for the 1939 crop than for the 1938. Oats were valued at \$105,963,000, an increase of \$16,626,-000; barley at \$33,147,000, an increase of \$4,701,000; rye \$5,766,000. an increase of \$2,619,000. The total value mixed grain was

placed at \$18,902,000, an increase of \$3,776,000. All the other coarse grains show-

ed increases, especially flax seed at \$3,030,000, more than double the year before when the crop was valued at \$1.420,000.


