Goodrich Expands Its Facilities

Are Busy Stepping Up Production to Mest The Increased Demand

Due to improvement in its volume of business since the early part of the year, and in the belief that Canada will continue to grow greater, additional floor space is being provided by Goodrich for manufacturing purposes through an expenditure of approximately \$85,000.

Work has already started to provide additional railway facilities into the plant at Kitchener, Ont. Certain floors within the plant are being extended. The General Office has been moved to the Dunker Building, and several departments will be relocated within the plant primarily to eliminate wastes in operations.

Goodrich, as is well known, manufactures the famous Life Saver Trend Silvertown, which product in the last several years has brought motor car users a greater feeling of security against skidding than has ever been available before in the forty-five years' history of the automobile. IMPROVED TIRES

In addition, Goodrich has expanded its tire lines in number and quality throughout the entire passe ger and commercial range, it has further introduced the Black and Gold Tube which, through the use of a special construction, is much more resistant to chafing and the destroying action of rust

Goodrich also reports an enlarged demand for its new High Cleat Tractor Tire for rear wheels operating on soft ground. It has also developed a Skidding Ring Tire for use on the front wheels of tractors, thus enabling the operators to "hold the line" when plow-

BETTER FOOTWEAR Improved volume in its famous footwear line, due to the introduction of many new types of Winter and Summer footwear, has also played a part in the Goodrich expansion program.

One of the most important causes for Goodrich moving ahead in its facilities is the growing uses of rubber in manufacturing plants, not only being modernized throughout Canada, but also in those new plants now being added to Canada's constantly growing industrial facilities.

More and more rubber is being used to protect metals from friction and from the corresive effects of acids, etc. Rubber is also being required extensively in the reduction of vibration within plants and on railway lines.





HEALTH **TOPICS**

ACID STOMACH A MYTH Acid stomach is largely a myth and calls for rearrangement of living habits rather than the use of alkaline preparations, according to Prof. Chester M. Jones of Har-

vard Medical school. 'Hyperacidity," he said in a lecture, "usually is only a supposed chemical disorder of the stomach" and taking medicine is not the way to attack the fundamental cause, which is "usually one of improper dietary or living habits."

A NATIONAL OBJECTIVE

"Education is the most potent weapon in the campaign of prevention of ill health arising from faulty or defective diet and nutrition." Pointing this out to a large audience in Toronto, Hon. Ian Mackenzie, Dominion Minister of Health, endorsed and launched a project undertaken by the Health League of Canada to advise women on the right foods to use. Practical demonstrations in cooking are to be given in a number of city schools. The syllabus for the course of instruction has been scientifically developed and when the success of the project is known, It is intended to outline the technique adopted, for the benefit of any part of Canada desirous of undertaking sim-

ilar work. The field of nutrition, said the Minister of Health, was above all the one in which Canadians, as individuals, could learn the most with the greatest benefits to them-

selves. "We need health in our armed forces," he continued. "We need health in the nation and we can achieve it only by having health in the home. Victory in the field will be a hollow achievement in this war if all that remains is a devitalized home land. We must not let down our health standard. On the contrary, if we are to be worthy of our fighting men we must strive to go forward in our war against ill-health."

During the last fifty years no animal plagues such as Foot and Mouth diseases, rinderpest or pleuro-pneumonia have occurred among Canadian live stock.
