McNAB MAKING APPEAL

An appeal has been entered against the sentence of three years and six months imposed on Chas. M. McNab, former Clerk and Treasurer of Walkerton by His Honour Judge W. G. Owen several weeks ago. Mr McNab pleaded guilty to misappropriating funds of the town, during a period of from Aug. 1 1937 to Dec. 31, 1939, to the amount of \$12,866.00. The appeal is being entered on the grounds that under the circumstances the sentence was too severe.

ELECTION COMMENTS

It's new Walter E. Harris, M. P. Now! On with our best war efforts. All three candidates conducted the campaign in Grey-Bruce on a high plane. Karl Knechtel's vote of 949 in Hanover was a nice appreciation from his home town. The snow bound condition of rural roads will be a good alibi for many a losing candidate. Midway village is evidently the strongest Liberal centre in the riding. Harris more than tripled his two opponents there. Markdale many years ago was a parliamentary centre in the days of the late T. S. Sproule and I. B. Lucas. And now it boasts another member. Sir Wilfred Laurier was Premier for 15 years; Mackenzie King has now served for 14 years, and will soon surpass Sir Wilfred's record. He many yet have the longest term of any Canadian premier, only Sir John A. Macdonald exceeding Laurier.

A permit is Required.

The attention of the public is drawn to the fact that where an entertainment or other such function is held with the purpose of raising funds for the Red Cross Society a permit to hold same must be obtained before advertising the same. No organization is permitted to use the name of the Red Cross Society without first obtaining a permit. This is provided for in the statutes.

Dr. Blair, Arthur, won North Wellington by nearly 1000; R. W. Gladstone, Guelph, goes back to South Wellington by nearly 3000 and W. R. Temlinson is returned in Bruce by 2134. All are liberals. W. P.
