For Naval Work - Three Are Being Altered Into Cruisers

Three Canadian sister ships that operated in passenger services on the Atlantic and Pacific coasts have been taken over by the government for war duties.

The North Star of the Clarke Steamship Company will be put into service by the Royal Canadian Navy, duties undisclosed. MERCHANT CRUISERS

This vesse! which cruised the Atlantic seaboard and the St. Lawrence River in the past few years. previously was named the Prince Henry and was built for the Pacific coast service of the Canadian National Steamships, Limited. Later it was purchased by the Clarke Co.

The Prince Robert and Prince David, with which the Prince Henry was operated on the west coast by C. N. Steamships, are being converted into armed merchant cruisers, the War Supply Board has announced. The three vessels for several years were in the triangle service hetween Vancouver, Victoria and Seattle.

#### Requirements For College Students

Principal of Queen's University Rates Intellectual Abil-

Intellectual ability was the first requirement for university entrance, Dr. R. C. Wallace, principal of Queen's University told the College and Secondary Department of the Ontario Educational Association convention. "In democratic countries a university education is for all who have the intellectual ability to go forward, and no others. They are expensive institutions-too expensive for those who have not that ability," he commented.

What University Should Teach A second demand for university entrance was the ability to express one's thoughts "clearly, concisely and with some degree of elegance" This applied more to the written word than the spoken one, he noted, warning against the danger of "facile utterance." A sense of accuracy, of the values in life, he piaced as a third requirement.

The university had a right to expect the student to come to it with a fairly considerable background of interest and activity in the fields of the social humanities, such as would provide a source from which to draw in constructive thinking on human problems, Dr. Wallace stated.

Canada Seen as Source of Supply of Syenite for American Potters



Sc., secretary of the Canadian Ceramic Society, told the ananal convention of the American Ceramic Society, meeting in Toronto, that the development of huge deposits of nepheline syenite, north of Peterborough, came from a intensive search by the potters' association of the United States for a substitute for the diminishing supplies of feldspar in that country. "This development is by Canada dan engineers and Canadian capital and, with crushing and refining plants at Lakefield, Ont., and at Rochester and Detroit, the ceramic - - trade is being supplied with this ingredient of glass and porcelain.

Canadian: feldspar, silica, china clay and kaolin are being mined on a large scale for use in the glass. paper and porcelain industries in United States and Canada, he said. Canada has 173 plants, with a capital investment of \$22,758,848, in its ceramic industry and, he pointed out, Northern Ontario has vast deposits of high-grade china clay, only waiting transportation for their development. A number of new potteries are producing art products on a large scale to take the place of that formerly imported from Japan and Czecho-Slovakia. he added.

Q. How can I stiffen the brushes of the sweeper? A. Take the brushes out of the sweeper, put a little common baking soda into some hot water and dip the brushes into it several

times. Allow to dry in the sun. Q. How can I lubricate the meat chopper and egg - beater without allowing any taste of the lubricant to be imparted to the food?

A. Use glycerine as a lubricant, and this will eliminate the possibility of any taste being imparted to the food.

Q. How can I clean greasestained overalls? A. Rub them well with lard. then scrub with a stiff brush, using a little ammonia in warm soapsuds.
