Dutch Display At Exhibition

Netherlands' Exhibit Is Expected To Arrive For the Opening of the C. N. E.

Even though The Netherlands government has prepared for any eventuality in the European war situation and is ready to defend itself against invasion, that country will be represented again this year at the Canadian National Exhibition according to a cable received at the C. N. E. The trade display will not be made by The Netherlands proper but by the Netherlands East Indies which comprise Java, Madeira, Borneo, Sumatra and Celebes.

NETHERLANDS, EAST INDIES Netherlands East Indies authorities in Batavia, Java, capital of the East Indies colonies, have reserved display space in the International Pavilion amounting to 2,400 square feet. Last year The Netherlands exhibit was among the most impressive in the International Pavilion and it was proposed to return this year with an even more comprehensive display of the products of the country. Not deterred by the situation in Europe the Dutch colonies in the East will endeavor to expand their trade in the Western Hemisphere by means of displays at the Canadian National Exhibition this year. Work has commenced on the preparation of the exhibit which will be shipped in time to arrive in Toronto early in Aug-

How Can I?

British Losses Said Negligible

Comparatively Few Merchant . Ships or Naval Vessels Sunk Since Beginning of Present War - German Claims Exaggerated

Germany's continued claims of sinkings of Royal Naval vessels last month in London brought a formal statement which summarized Britain's and Germany's naval losses since war began. It showed that the Nazis had lost 24 shis, exclusive of a large number of submarines.

British lesses, including submarines, number 18. (Submarines lost were listed at five).

CRUISERS INTACT The statement clearly showed that whereas Germany's losses represented a staggering blow to her naval strength, Britain's strength at sea remained unim-

Of the 15 capital ships Britain possessed at the start of the war, only the Royal Oak has been lost. The Courageous is the only one of seven aircraft carriers lost. Britain has not lest a single cruiser. Her other losses are 10 destroyers of the pre-war fleet of 185 and five submarines.

NAZI BATTLESHIPS GONE German casualties include both her battleships, two of her three pocket battle hips, both of her heavy cruisers, all six-inch gun cruisers with which she started the war, and 12 surface torpedo craft.

SINCE NORWAY Unofficial estimates of U-Boat sinkings by the Allies have ranged as high as 60.

Naval sources point out the statement is not the whole story. Since Hitler invaded Norway, 26 transports and supply ships have been sunk or scuttled. Ten others were hit by torpedoes and probably sunk. One was set on fire during an air stack and four German vessels were captured.
