Third Record Tobacco Year

In Canada in 1939 - High Record of Production Showing An Eight Per Cent. Increase Over '38

For the third successive year, a new high record of tobacco production in Canada was reached according to data compiled by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics. The harvest was one of 109,846,000 pounds from 91,035 acres.

MORE FLUE-CURED This was an eight per cent increase over the 101,394,600 pounds of 1938 from 83,575 acres. The most marked expansion was in the flue-cured acreage, especially in Quebec. Burley tobacco in Ontario and pipe varieties in Quebec also had a larger acreage. There was a slight decrease in the area planted to cigar leaf.

An increased outlet was found for the flue-cured tobacco in Britain in 1939, when exports reached a new peak of 26,684,-733 during the crop year which ended September last. SERIOUS MARKET PROBLEM

Upon the outbreak of war, this market was virtually closed to the Canadian product, with exports from Canada to the United Kingdom limited to 6, 000,000 pounds. This has resulted in a serious problem for which there is no immediate solution in sight, reports the

At present, the prospects are for a carryover of a surplus of abuot 30,000,000 pounds into the crop year of 1940-41 of flue-cured tobacco alone.

A planned decrease in acreage this year is indicated.

Should Revise School Studies

Many of the students were not yet university material, yet they were taking courses so designed, he said. The answer was not to be found in technical schools for the majority of students showed no aptitude for this type of training.

TEACH DEMOCRACY Mr. Carrothers, claiming democracy was just a name to Ontario students, said the principles of democracy were not taught in all high schools.

The two-day meeting of the board opened with an address by President Lorne Eedy of St. Marys who said Canada would more easily be unified if it had a uriform educational system.



balance. The ear, nose and throat examination also is severe. Good hearing is essential, variations in the sound of the engine may be important, and a pilot must be able to hear messages coming through his earphones under any conditions of

But it is the man's general characteristics which are the real pointers. Good fighter pilots vary a great deal in appearance - in their height - in chest measurement and in purely physical characteristics - but they all have something in common. This is a quality which indicates good mental and physical
