Tartans Go Back To 15th Century

First Appeared in Scotland at That Time - "Tartan" and "Plaid" Not Same Thing

If you look in the dictionary you will find that a tartan is a "cloth woven in colored stripes crossing at right angles."

This, however, doesn't take us very far, and we have to go elsewhere to find out the history of tartans. The name itself is derived from the French "tiretaine", the name of a special kind of cloth. which shows that tartans are not, as many people seem to think, peculiar to any particular country or nation, the design being found in many European countries, although Scotland can boast of a large number of different ones.

NOT PECULIAR TO SCOTLAND The earliest record of tartans being worn in Scotland goes back to the middle of the 15th century. As time went on the various Scottish clans adopted a different arrangement of colors and lines, some of them having from one to five quite distinct tartans, such as the common clan tartan of the chief which is worn only by himself and his heir; the dress tartan, which is used on special occasions; the hunting tartan and the mourning tartan.

Finally let me say that the term "tartan" must never be mistaken for the term "plaid" since a plaid need not necessarily be of tartan pattern, but is merely a garment made of woollen cloth.

457 Canadians Earn More Than \$50,000 Annually

This Group of Individuals Pays 17 Per Cent. of the Total Income Tax in Canada

The National Revenue Department has announced income tax collections in April totalled \$17,078-779 compared with \$15,179,272 in April last year, an increase of \$1,-899,506.

Of the 264,804 persons who paid \$46,937,205 in income tax in the fiscal year ended March 31, 1939, 119,346 were in the income class under \$2,000, the National Revenue Department disclosed recently in its monthly review.

119,346 UNDER \$2,000 They contributed \$1,269,723 or 2.66 per cent. of the total amount paid by individuals. The number with incomes from \$2,000 to \$3,000 was 63,572 and they paid \$1,324,663 while those with incomes of from \$3,000 to \$4,000 numbered 34,392 and contributed \$1.462,000.

Of other individual taxpayers, there were 457 earning more than \$50,000 a year. These represented 17 per cent. of the total and contributed \$17,289,363, an average of \$37,832 each; or 36,17 per cent. of total payments.


U. S. Birthrate Is Still Falling

Cheese Factories Work Feverishly

In Eastern Ontario Most of Them Are Working at Capacity to Supply Foreign and Domestic Needs

A survey in the Eastern Ontario cheese-producing district around Belleville indicated last week that practically all factories are working at capacity. District dairymen expressed belief they would supply at least a portion of the 78,400,000 pounds of cheese recently ordered by the British government, to be delivered at a set price of 14 cents a pound, f.o.b. Montreal.

SWITCH TO UNCOLORED The effect of British preference for uncolored cheese is noted on the Belleville board .A premium of 1/2-cent was offered for the uncolored variety and this is believed to be responsible for many factories switching entirely to making uncolored. Domestic trade, however, has always shown a marked preference for colored. Fred Mallory, secretary of the

Believille board, commented the 14cent price offered little margin of profit for the buyer since last week's price was 13 9-16 cents, and that left only 7-16 to cover the cost of wiring boxes for shipment, and handling and transportation charg-

PREVENT TOOTH DECAY Perhaps the greatest advance that has been made in dentistry in the hundred years of its existence has been in public education of the necessity for cleaning teeth in order to prevent decay. It is difficult for us to realize that the toothbrush and cheap dentifrices are themselves of fairly modern origin. The first toothbrushes were made of horse hair or pieces of cloth or linen, sometimes of sponge.

SAD STATISTICS The use of the toothbrush is still in its infancy, according to statistics, for it is estimated that 70 per cent. of the population of North America have never had their teeth examined and about 60 per cent. have never brushed their teeth.

The idea of filling teeth and preserving them instead of pulling them out is also an introduction of the last century.
