Ontario to Get Most of Refugee Children

Forty per cent. of all refugee children coming to Canada from Great Britain will become the responsibility of Ontario, Hon. Eric Cross, Minister of Welfare, announced in informing a conference at Queen's Park of the plans already made. The Welfare Minister expressed gratification at the action of University authorities of Toronto in placing its residence accommodation at the disposal of the Ontario Government. Within the next two weeks the first contingent of children, numbering about 1,200 will arrive in Canada and from then on they will arrive weekly in groups of 300. "We have on our lists 10,000 homes available for children," said Mr Cross. "It is our intention to launch a campaign to obtain the full-hearted co-operation of all our citizens in this worthy endeavour. There is one thing which should be pointed out at this time. Persons offering their homes to refugee children will not be asked to bear the cost of hospitalization in the event the children become sick. This expense will be met by the Dominion Government." Volunteer workers will be utilized extensively in the matter of placements, it was stated. Local Children's Aid Societies will be given complete control over all placements in private homes.

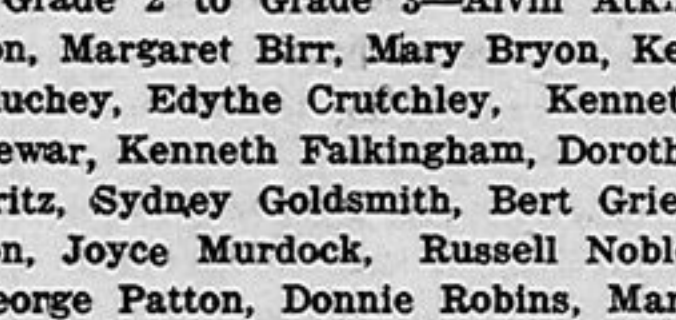
