Ottawa Feb. 12th.

The Speaker took the chair at 3 o'clock.

Mr. Alfred McCarty was introduced by Sir John Macdonald and Dr. Tupper, and on taking his seat was received with cheers.

Mr. Bartie introduced a bill, which at 4 o'clock was declared to be the first bill of the session.

The Minister of Finance laid on the table the House accounts.

Mr. Brown wanted to know if the Government had taken any action upon the notification of the Imperial Board of Trade, that the Allan Steamships will not be allowed to clear at the Custom House, unless the surrogates have graduated in one of the colleges in Great Britain. Hon. Mr. Smith said their attention had been called to it generally, but no official communication had been received.

He was understood to say that the Government had made some kind of remonstrance.

Mr. Brown moved for leave to address His Excellency for a return showing the general nature and value of all the manufactures of goods imported into Canada from the United States in 1874-75.

Mr. Currier moved an address for correspondence respecting the navigation of American canals and rivers.

Hon. Mr. Smith moved an address of condolence on the death of a member of the Mounted Police detachment.


