The report of the Postmaster-General is, as usual, a very interesting decument. The following statistics show the extent of the postal business of the Dominion on the 30th of June, 1876:-

Number of post offices, 5,015; Miles of postal route, 38,391. Miles of annual mail travel, 14,878,663. Number of letters, 41,800,000. Post cards, 4,646,000.

Registered letters, 1,77',300. Free Letters, 1,059,292. Newspapers and periodicals, 38,5:9,000. Book parcels, 4,539,912. Parcels, 70,724.

Revenue for year ending 30th June, 1876, \$1,481,886. Expenditure, \$1,959,758. Number of money order offices, 742.

Amount of money orders issued, 56. Number of Post-office Savings Bank offices on the 1st of January, 1877, 278. Number of depositors on the 80th of

June, 1876, 24,415. Total amount deposited, \$1,726,204. Amount of deposits and accurated interest on the 80th of June, 1876, \$2,740,982.
