DOMINION PARLIAMENT... Ottawa, March 27. After routine and other important business the House went into Committee on Mr. Blake's Bill respecting branches of the County Council to enter into an arrangement with the Town Council, with the view of utilizing the prison labor.

Ottawa, March 28. Mr. Mackenzie, in reply to Mr. DeBorja, said the probability was that the measure would be adopted by which Canada would be represented at the International Exhibition to be held in France in 1878.

Mr. Mackenzie was quite surprised to hear complaints of the progress of the Welland Canal; it had been carried on with most remarkable vigor. There was a very little yet to be put under contract, but it would be put on contract as soon as possible.

Ottawa, March 29. Mr. Mackenzie's Bill to authorize the transfer of the Truro and Pictou branch of the Intercolonial Railway to the person or company desiring to take it over from the Government, was read the third time, and an amendment was proposed.

Ottawa, April 2nd. A few important private Bills having been introduced, a number of motions for adjournment were made, and the House adjourned.
