How to Cure Hams and Pork.

Great quantities of ham and pork are spoiled every year through careless curing. Ham that is so salt as to make it necessary to parboil, or soke a slice before it can be boiled or fried, has not been rightly cured

The following mode of treating ham or pork is most excellent :- For a few days after killing, the hams should be hung up in a clean, dry place. Then, with one gallon of molasses, mix throughly two ounces of saltpetre and four quarters of fine ground salt. Cover the hams with this mixture, spreading it over every part with a wooden paddle. 
