fend myself as well as others from misrepresentation. What I did say was, "The Saviour places no difference in point of time between believing and having." I would never teach men that believing was the same thing as having ; The Galt Evangelists never taught such false theology as that. But Old Paths contradicts himself. for he first holds me up to ridicule for say. ing that believing is having, and then he asserts it is the same in the following quotation, letter 6th :- "To the extent that eternal life means pardon, justification, it is true believing is having." Now, if I am true to my name for saying believing is having, what is Old Paths when he deliberately reiterates it as true? But I did not make such an assertion; so the inference to be drawn is that Old Paths, the newspaper letter writer, is a foe to the old paths of touth. Any one who asserts that believing is having is taking a new deparmre, and trying to form a new path. He s ranning into the same estrich theology or which he donounces the men of Galt, when he represents them as saying what they did not say, (Letter 5th), "Believe that you are saved and you are saved." They represented believing and having as two things, and also, that there was no lifference in point of time between believing and having, in proof of which they quoted many passages like the following: "He that believeth hath everlasting life." To assert that "believing is having" is omething similar to assert to a drowning man, who had no provided means to save simself. "Take courage, believe that you are saved and you are saved." The poor ellow might have a flickering hope for an govided means, but the flash of hope rould scon give way to the wail of dessair. But let the speaker shoot out with boat to the rescue of the drowning one. while he shouts "take courage, trust me, I'll save you." The drowning man first trusts or believes, and secondly he is caved. Such illustrations, of course, must unturally be imperfect in some of the particulars, but we can nevertheless perceive that believing or trusting is a very different thing from being saved under the circumstances pictured; but Old Paths would have us believe that they are the same thing when applied to spiritual matters. ## The Late Dr. Hodge.

The Rev. Charles Hodge, late Professor of Theology at Princeton, who died recenty, was born in Philadelphia in 1797. He early in life distinguished himself as a vigorons writer and thinker. In 1820 he was appointed Assistant Professor of Biblical Literature in Princeton College, and about the same time became Editor of the Prince ton Review, a periodical which has been chiefly indebted to Dr. Hodge for the great miluence which it has exercised in the higher departments of scelesiastical litera-

mre. The New York Observer says of him that "As a writer in theological, ethics1" and ecclesiastical discussion, Dr. Hedge was easily at the head of all his contemporaries in those fields. And the distinguishing grace of his writings was their exquisite elearness. No one was at a loss to know what he believed, what he intended to teach, and the anthority on which he relied. With him the word of God was the end of all controversy. His theology was biblical. In the profoundest discussion a text of Holy Scripture is as a rock on which his structure of argument rests.
