Temperance.

The by-law for the repeal of the Dunkin Act will be submitted to the ratepayers of Peterboro' (town) for their votes on the 9th of December.

The Licensed Victuallers of York, Ont., are about to seek the repeal of the Dunkin Act in that county. The friends of the Act expect to contest successfully the repeal movement.

It is stated as a fact that the City of Lewiston, Maine, with a population of 18,000 has not had an arrest for drunkenness in twenty years.

On the 12th ult. a vote was taken to repeal the township Dunkin by-law in the front of Leeds and Lansdowne. At the close of the poll the vote stood: For repeal, 16; against, 217—thus giving a majority for Dunkin of 201 good, solid votes.
