

TOWNSHIP OF PROTON.

PROPOSED BY-LAW

To aid and assist the TORONTO, GREY and BRUCE RAILWAY COMPANY, by giving the sum of \$5,000.00 Eight thousand dollars by way of bonus to the said Company, and to issue Debentures therefor, and to authorize the levying of a special rate for the payment of the Debentures and interest.

WHEREAS by the Act of Legislature of the Province of Ontario, incorporated in the several Acts relating to the said Company, power is given to the said Council to aid and assist the said Company in the construction of the said Railway, and to issue Debentures therefor, and to authorize the levying of a special rate for the payment of the Debentures and interest.

AND WHEREAS the Township of Proton is a municipality interested in assisting the change of gauge, construction or reconstruction of said Railway, and in the manner herein provided.

AND WHEREAS it is expedient to grant aid by way of bonus to the said Company (Eight thousand dollars) in the manner stated in said By-Law.

AND WHEREAS for such purpose it is necessary for the said Municipality to raise by way of loan the said amount of Eight thousand dollars in the manner herein provided.

AND WHEREAS it will require the sum of \$750.00 (Seven hundred and fifty dollars) to be raised by special rate on the whole rateable property lying within the said Municipality for the purpose of paying the said interest and interest on the debentures to be issued therefor as hereinafter mentioned.

AND WHEREAS the amount of the whole rateable property of the Municipality of the Township of Proton according to the assessed valuation of the year 1890, is \$2,125,000.00 (Two million, one hundred and twenty-five thousand dollars).

AND WHEREAS the amount of the existing debentures of said Company is \$200,000.00 (Two hundred thousand dollars) and the amount of the interest thereon is \$10,000.00 (Ten thousand dollars) per annum.
