## The Pacific Aflame.

Ships in the neighborhood of the Sand-

wich Islands can now witness one of the grandest spectacles that earth affords. The Manuna Loa is again belching forth fiery torrents. The mighty forces imprisoned under the beds of the Pacific are finding yent through this volcano cone. Manua Loa is a volcanic situated on the island of Hawaii. It is 13,700 feet high and is markel by two distinct craters, one at the summit, and the other, Kilsues, at a somewhat lower level. This island bee been the scene of several marvelous exhibitions of volcanic fury. There was a great eruption in 1840 and in 1843 ; but these were exceeded in August, 1855, when the flow of fire, smoke, and lava continued until July 1856. The evidence of this torrent was discovered for a distance of over sixty miles. The floor of the great crater Kilauea, resembled, it was said, a lake of fire which had been scooped one thousand feet deep, and covered an area of twenty-eight square miles. This enormous vent relieves the great basin of the Central Pacific, the rim of which rests upon a volcanic formation, set with volcanoes all around.
