The Council met at the Town Hall on Monday, March 14, pursuant to adjournment. All the members present. Minutes of meeting read and confirmed.

Communications from D. L. Scott, A. B. Laing were presented and read, accounts from Jas. Swollen and J. C. Fox. Mr. Bailey moved, seconded by Mr. H. that the Rev. issue an order in favor of the trustees of S. S.
