The passengers were rescued by the crew, and were landed at Capetown, where they were treated with the utmost care. The vessel was found to be full of provisions, and the crew were found to be in good health. The cause of the disaster is still unknown, but it is believed to have been caused by a combination of factors, including a severe storm and a fire on board.
