THE MAN OF MODERATE MEANS.

THE WAR IN THE EAST.

Another Battle in Which the Japs Were Victorious.

An official despatch says that Major-General Noda's division commenced an attack upon the Chinese position at 5.30 a. m. on Thursday. By 9.30 a. m. Kai-Ping was taken. The Chinese fled towards Hai-Shak-Sai, with the Japanese in pursuit. The numbers killed and wounded on either side are not known. The first army was welcomed by the inhabitants, while moving its headquarters to Shen-Yen, where many manifestations of strong desire to remain under Japanese rule.

Reports also received from Kin-Chow state that the Japanese are moving down to support the Kai-Ping force, which has retired towards New Chwang. At Kai-Ping the Chinese numbered 3,000 men and they had 12 guns. About 200 Chinese were killed. The number of wounded Chinese is not known. About 150 prisoners were taken. The Japanese casualties are not stated.

SENATOR TASSE DEAD.

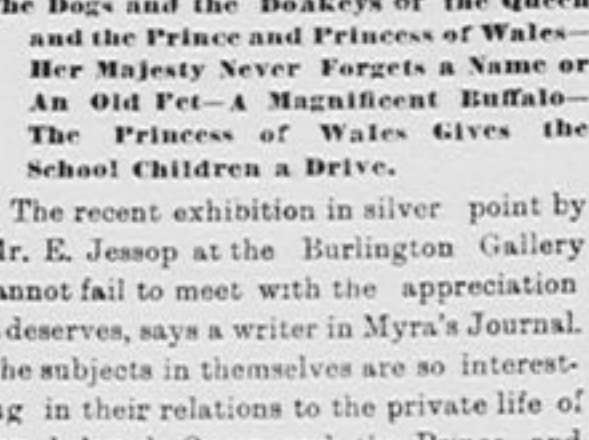
He was a Politician, Journalist and Author—Hill For Three Months.

A despatch from Montreal says—Senator Tasse died three months' morning at 5.30 o'clock, after three months' illness. He has been unconscious for nearly a fortnight. He was 45 years of age, and leaves a wife and two daughters. For 15 years he has been editor of La Minerve, and was an uncompromising Conservative. He formerly represented Ottawa in the Commons and succeeded the late Senator Trudel in the Senate. Mr. Tasse was unsuccessful in several elections. He was one of the Canadian Commissioners at Chicago at the World's Fair, and was the author of several books.

They have all coats of a rich light red, and are of a rare species, their striking peculiarity being that they have red noses instead of the usual black.

The Princess's own four-stall pony stable is twenty feet square, with dark chocolate-colored iron work, the pillars between the stalls having silver-plated caps, and the walls being covered with glazed white and green tiles. The ponies' names are in gold letters on blue enamel tablets. This stable is sacred to its four inmates—Bessie, Huffy, Bean, and Belle. The pet driving carriage, the Princess often stops with her light blue, eighteen years old, standing thirty inches high, and driven by her royal mistress, she trots gaily through the village, where cottagers stand to cheer the royal carriage. The Princess often stops when the children are coming out of school, and picks up as many of these little ones as she can find to drive with her. They sit on their horses, and part from them with a smile, saying, "Now you can say you were with the Queen."
