THE ONTARIO LEGISLATURE

During the week the sittings of the House of Assembly would have been a very quiet and business like character but for the bomb thrown on the floor of the House by Mr. Haycock in reference to railway passes given to the Members of the House, and Mr. Haycock accordingly moved, that the receiving of a pass by any member from a railway Company would be regarded as an offence against the Independence of Parliament Act, and necessitate the expulsion from the House.

The Hon. Mr. Ross, Minister of Education announced that certain arrangements had been effected with the publishing houses, by which the school books would be much reduced in price. A new text book on Euclid and Algebra has been prepared for the Junior leaving students. It will only cost 25 cents, thus saving one dollar to each of 12,000 pupils preparing for the High School Arithmetic giving the modernized treatment of the subject can be purchased for sixty cents now and against seven cents for the former text book.

The problem of the Manitoba Schools is not easy of solution. Dogmatic religious teaching is not to be thought of and the other alternative of eliminating everything relating to religion, even the name and attributes of the Deity, and all references to a revealed religion is equally objectionable to nearly all. Where then is there a middle course? We humbly suggest that some such book as the much abused "scripture selections" commonly called the Ross Bible, would prove a valuable medium.

By an Order-in-Council passed on Saturday the Act of Parliament providing for the new ballot is to be brought into force immediately. The new ballot will leave little opportunity, if any, for errors such as frequently spoil votes. It will be blank except the blank space opposite the name of each candidate, on which the voter is to make his mark. If mistakes occur under this plan they will be either from ill ignorance or gross carelessness. The new ballot will be tried in the bye-elections, and that will test its utility for the general elections.

Prince Bismarck has just reached his eightieth birthday, and has been honored, beyond most men, by the German people. From early morning till late on the anniversary of his birthday the town of Friedrichsthal was thronged with sightseers, and delegations of various bodies presenting him with congratulatory addresses. Prince Bismarck's reply was given with all the vigor and mental grasp of his early days. In effect he advised the German people to hold by the German Empire, and Mistake have been committed in part by some of the German States. But the conclusion of States known as the German Empire have been welded into one homogeneous whole, the chief factor in this work of consolidation being Bismarck. Both, with little effect, have been making attempts at colonizing. But the genius of the Frenchman does not lie in colonizing. His real aspirations lie in and around Paris, so that it seems as though he can give himself so much needless about a matter which his whole history has shown him to be incapable of carrying on. Home affairs, however are not in the not a happy condition in France. The ministry of M. Hanotaux was a makeshift, and exists on sufferance. The Madagascar expedition has not excited the French Ministry as the eyes of the world. And this march of irresponsible expeditions on the head state of the Niger and the Nile may be in the way of diverting public attention from their matters at home. But as to war with Great Britain public opinion is, that such a step would be the height of folly on the part of France.
