Customs Payment Made in Gold. The Customs Department at Ottaws have received a most unique payment for Customs duties, being about 200 ounces of gold dust, valued at \$4,000. This was ollected for duties by the North-West nounted police officer at Fort Cuhady, Yukon district, who also acts as collector of Customs. As there are neither bank notes nor coin in the district payment was made in "the currency of the country," that is gold dust, which "goes" at \$20 per ounce. The dust was in a buckskin bag, packed in a small but very strong den box. It was shipped down the Yukon to St. Michael's, at the mouth of the river, thence by steamer to Vancouver, B.
