

The salaries of the established staff, including Marine and Fisheries, amounted to \$54,992.50. The expenditure was \$76,796.54 less than the amount voted by Parliament. The fiscal year the expenditure for main-

maintenance and construction, \$475,903.-22, while for the previous year the expenditure for lighthouse and coast service, including construction, was \$476,-225.85, showing a decrease of expenditure for the year ending June 30 of last \$322.63. 
