THE DAY OF PICNICS.

From the earliest green buds of spring, when Nature finds her first invitations, until all is brown and dead, to the woods ring with the merry laughter of boys and girls, both old and young, for who does not feel young again when in the company of gladness youth and nature. A picnic is a delightful form of amusement, providing the weather does not frown, and the company also.

First, and important, too, is the dress. To the men no advice need be given, for as a rule, they are usually suitably attired on all occasions, but women know it is their duty to look pretty and picturesque and so are seldom provided in case of rain or cold. Thin, dainty dresses look charming in the woods, but the most serviceable and neatest costume in a dark wool skirt with a light, becoming waist, or an entire dress of outing flannel. Large hats look picturesque, but if there is to be a trip on the water, the sun and wind will play havoc with the complexion for, as every one knows, the reflection of the sun on the water is worse than the sun itself. Extra wraps should always be provided and a number may be strapped together in a neat bundle, so as to be conveniently carried.

A hammock or two should always be carried along, together with some interesting games for those who do not care to ramble and explore. Cards have been found very amusing and the gentlemen always have the liberty to smoke in the woods.

Now for a most enjoyable part of the program—the lunch on the green sward beneath the trees. First, and most essential, are the sandwiches, of which there are many kinds. We do not re-lish great thick slices of bread with some cold beef between, but must have something that looks as well as it tastes. For these, then, have fresh, round, flaky biscuits, or thin-sliced bread. They can be cut and buttered the evening before if the execution goes off very early in the morning, and closely wrapped in paraffin paper and placed in the refrigerator. It is best, however, to defer filling them until the picnic ground is reached. Chicken, ham and sardines make delicious sandwiches, but must be finely chopped or minced and well seasoned. Crisp lettuce leaves dipped in mayonnaise and placed between bread makes appetizing sandwiches, and thin-sliced cucumbers also. Cheese and hard-boiled eggs, thinly sliced or mashed with or without mustard, are a nice change.

Some things are so well appreciated on these occasions as bread or fried chicken, which should be carefully wrapped in paraffin paper or put into a dish where it cannot absorb the flavors of other viands. Saratoga potatoes are so relished.

If convenient, a brush fire can be made and coffee boiled. It is a delightful change from the inevitable lemonade. Cream can be carried in tightly-corked bottles after it has been scalded, and will keep sweet. Coffee and wagon is obtainable. It will be convenient to have the provisions, chairs and other traps conveyed to the picnic ground in that manner, and then a small oil stove will save the trouble of building fires and cleaning smoked coffee pots. If it is possible to have it, will be found most enjoyable, for then water, fruit and melons can be kept cool and refreshing.

Of course everyone must expect spiders and ants and a scarcity of cups and plates, and remember also that finger food made and used before forks. For all that, everything should be made as dainty and appetizing as possible.

TO WASH WINDOWS.

Try saving the tea that is left over and use it for cleaning windows, mirrors or other glass. It will give a fine polish and is good whether used hot or cold. After washing with a cloth dipped in the tea wipe the glass dry, then polish with a flannel cloth.

SOME PICNIC GOODIES.

Wine Cake.—Beat ten ounces of butter to a cream; add one pound of sugar gradually and beat until light. Add eight eggs unbeaten, one at a time, beating each one until the egg is thoroughly mixed in before adding another. Then add one and one-half cups of milk, one pound and ten ounces of flour and beat until light. When ready to put in the pans mix in lightly and quickly two teaspoons of baking powder. Dust the cake molds with sugar, pour in the batter and bake an hour in a moderate oven.

Orange Short Cake.—Make a rich baking powder "short cake." While this is baking prepare the orange filling as follows: Pare the oranges, being very careful to remove every second spoonful of whipped cream over each slice. Four or five oranges will be needed.

Cinnamon Rolls.—Roll out some pie paste in long, narrow strips, and lavishly spread with a mixture composed of brown sugar and butter, creamed together and highly flavored with cinnamon. Roll them up, moisten and pinch the edges and ends well together and bake in a hot oven. When partly done brush the top over with a little of the mixture reserved for that purpose.

Polish Tarts.—Roll out some pie paste and cut it into three-inch squares. Brush each square with the white of an egg, then fold all the corners into the center; brush again with egg, sift with sugar and bake to a pale golden brown. When done, remove a small piece from the center and fill with bright-colored jelly or jam.

Hickory Nut Macaroons.—Pound fine a cupful of hickory nut meats, beat three eggs and mix with them. Flavor

with a teaspoonful of vanilla and stir in a pound of sugar. Mix well and add the beaten whites of two eggs to make a thick paste of the mixture. Drop in small spoonfuls on greased paper and bake fifteen minutes in a moderate oven.

A PRETTY EFFECT.

A charming scheme of decoration for a small dinner table, lighted by a hanging lamp, may be carried out as follows: A green and white wicker basket wreathed with trails of asparagus fern and smilax, and filled with white flowers and ferns, and sprays of ivy and herberis, hangs from the lamp, the handle being tied with bright yellow satin ribbons. The table center is of yellow brocade, cut in star shape and bordered with narrow silver galon. Trails of smilax and fern tied with bows of yellow ribbon are arranged round the dessert dishes, and silver dishes containing salted almonds and bonbons are placed at the point of the star-shaped center.

HOW TO CLEAN KETTLES.

Sometimes the most careful washing will not wholly remove the flavor or odor from the utensil in which food has been cooked. This is frequently the case with fish, onions, cabbage, etc.

There is a remedy which may be a little trouble, and yet it is well worth trying. After any of these articles have been cooked, wash the utensil carefully with soap and water. Now nearly fill it with cold water, and for each quart of water add a teaspoonful of washing soda. Place on the stove and let the water get boiling hot. Empty the water, rinse the utensil with clean water, and on wiping dry it will be found perfectly sweet.

A TIGER HUNT IN INDIA.

Fate of a Guide Who Did a Foolhardy Thing in the Jungle.

Dr. J. H. Porter describes his Indian guide, who showed him a tiger's lair, as a lean, black, wolf-like man whose name was Sikunder Singh, who was a monomaniac about tigers.

TRAVELS OF A BULLET.

Fired at a Buck, It Jumped Over Two Hills and Wounded a Man.
