

This remarkable ceremony was instituted according to Flemish historians. in the year 1099, under the auspices of the Count of Flanders, Robert II., of Jerusalem, its object being to show honor to the relicts which were brought to Farnes in that year from the Holy Land. Through the centuries it has been celebrated, almost always with the same earnestness, precision and attention to detail.

What adds to the really extraordinary character of this procession is the fact that the leading personages, such as the royal Magi, the doctors and the Lords of King Herod's court, talk to each in the old Flemish tongue, which usolem is a curious scene. Children and townspeople shout "Hosannah!" and are ollowed by the 12 Apostles and by Jesus, who is mounted on an ass. Nothing more mystical can be imagined than he emaciated, pale and refined countenance of the young man who represents our Lord, and whose head is covered with an Assyrian wig. An onerous task is his, for he has

pledged himself to maintain, during the entire course of the procession, his marble stillness and angelic serenity of countenance. During the latter scenes of Christ's life the emotion of the spectators is intense. Painful, indeed, is it to see him carrying the cross. 
