MR. CHAMBERLAIN WAS UNDER POLICE PROTECTION.

During His Stay in the States He had a Body Guard of Detectives-Mr. Endi-

cott's House Surrounded Day and Night. A despatch from Boston, Mass., says: -Fear of the Irish dynamiters extends across the Atlantic, and to the remote and secluded hamlet of Danvers, Mass. The Right Hon. Joseph Chamberlain, England's Colonial Secretary, who suddenly and unannounced sailed from New York on Wednesday, on the Germanic, has been under constant armed guard during his entire visit of several weeks, at "The residence of his father-in-law, ex-Secretary of War Endicott. The guard was also present in force when Sir Richard Cartwright called upon Mr. Chamberlain, as it was feared that if there was to be any attack it would be made gether. The entire neighborhood is stirred up to a high pitch of excitement over the startling announcement that imminent danger threatened the public peace of the town and the life of their illustrious guests. The first rumours were received with incredulity, but now the gravest fears are authoritatively substantiated. It is now known that not only was Mr. Chamberlain himself in fear of his life, but that fear was officially shared by both the British and United States Governments. During his entire stay, Mr. Chamberlain has had a bodyguard of from three to six detectives, day and once or twice a week, and to do the night.
