The Law on the Subject.

To Regulate Deer hunting.

No person shall at any time hunt, pur sue, kill, wound or capture any deer in the waters of any river or lake within the limits of the Province of Ontario, or immediately after leaving such waters, and any persons carrying a rifle, carbine or shot gun, and stationed in a canoe, skiff, punt or boat of any kind, at or near any place where hunted deer are likely to enter the water during the open season, shall prima facie be deemed to be engaged in hunting or pursuing deer within the meaning of this section.

No person who is a resident of and domiciled in the Province of Ontario shall hunt, take, or kill, wound or destroy any deer without first having ob provisions hereinafter set forth and the fee for such licenses shall be two dollars

There shall be attached to each li cense two shipping coupons, one of which shall be signed and detached by the person to whom the heense issued in the presence of the shipping agent at the point of ship ment and attached to each deer or part of deer about to be shipped, and such coupon shall be cancelled by the carrier on arrival at the point of destination by writing across the face "cancelled."

Sub-section 5 of section 2 of Ontario Game Protection Act. 1893, is hereby repealed and the following substituted got all the necessary qualifications.
