

Newspaper Laws.

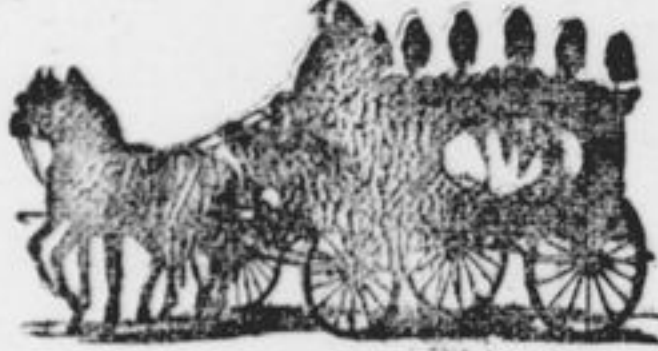
We call the special attention of Postmaster and subscribers to the following synopsis of the new laws:

THE FARM.

MERITS OF DIFFERENT CATTLE FEEDS.

In a consideration of various feeds for cattle a correspondent decides that oats, as a dairy food, is worth at least 15 percent more than wheat bran, and 10 percent more than mill feed (bran and shorts). In a breeding herd the difference in value is even greater.

Good corn silage is excelled in milk-giving value by no other one food, unless it be good pasture grass. Like grass, it brings out all the inherent value of dry food.

A good silo increases the cow-keeping capacity of a good farm by at least one-third. Some claim one-half. Silage also adds very materially to the condition of the cows during the winter.

Corn meal deserves a good place in all rations for Jersey cows, newspaper chemists to the contrary notwithstanding.

The man who, seeking cheapness, sacrifices quality in buttermaking is truly penny wise and pound foolish. It is at all times not only desirable but a duty to reduce the cost of foods to the lowest point consistent with the preservation of the health of the cows and the maintenance of the quality of their product.

Cottonseed meal furnishes more nitrogen at less cost than any other of the foods common to our markets.
