# THE TEXT OF THE TREATY

BETWEEN THE UNITED STATES AND GREAT BRITAIN.

Details of the Agreement-Made to Settle all Disputes-How the Arbitrators are

The preamble expresses the desire of Great Britain and the United States to consolidate the relations of amity happily existing between them, and to consecrate by treaty the principle of international arbitration.

Article I .- The parties agree to arbitrate, subject to this treaty, all questions in difference which they may fail and adjust themselves by diplomatic ne-

gotiations. Article II .- All pecuniary claims or groups of claims, which in the aggregate do not exceed £100,000 in amount and do not involve the determination of territorial claims, shall be dealt with and decided by an arbitration tribunal constituted as provided for in the following articles.




