This week we give a sketch of Her Majesty, written when she had reigned one year. Gladstone was in parliament then, but still in obscurity, Salisbury had not been heard of, Chamberlain was'nt born. only daughter of the duke of Kent, the fourth son of George III., and of Leopold, king of the Belgians. She was born on the 24th of May, 1819, and had reached the age (eighteen) required by the law, before she could in the month previous to her accession to the throne on the death of William the present memorable day her Mejesty was crowned, and now reigns over an affectionate and trusting people by all possible legal titles.
