Some Coronation Anecdotes, during the last 800 years of English History.

The Past and the Present of English Royalty.

From the London Sun, June 28 1838.

HENRY III.

After the death of John, London being in possession of the French prince Louis, an assembly of the principal authorities was convened at Winchester, under the presidency of Gualo, the papal legate. They unanimously resolved that the young king should be crowned on the 28th of October, A. D. 1216. The ceremony was performed at the cathedral of Winchester. The papal legate compelled Henry to do homage to the holy Roman church and Pope Innocent, for his kingdom of England and Ireland;—He also made him swear that he would pay an annual tribute of one thousand marks to the papal see. The ceremony of coronation was repeated by Stephen Langton archbishop of Canterbury.

The ceremony of her coronation was performed with extraordinary pomp on the 22nd of January. Holinshed's account is as follows:

"At the solemnity of the feast and coronation of the queen, all the high peers of the realm both spiritual and temporal were present, there to exercise their offices as to them appertained. The citizens of London were there in great array, bearing afore him in solemn wise three hundred and three score cups of gold and silver, in token that they ought to wait upon his cup. Archbishop of Canterbury (according to his duty) crowned him, the bishop of London assisting him as his deacon. The citizens of London served out wine to every one in great plenty. The feast was plentiful, so that nothing wanted that could be wished. Moreover in Tothill-fields roiall justes were holden by the space of eight daies together."

EDWARD I.

On the 15th of August, 1274, Edward I. and his queen Eleanor was crowned at Westminster by the Archbishop of Canterbury, aided by other prelates. Holinshed adds some remarkable particulars of this coronation:—"At this coronation were present, Alexander king of Scots, and John earl of Bretaine, with their wives that were sisters to King Edward. The king of Scots did homage unto King Edward for the realms of Scotland, in like manner as other the kings of Scotland before him had done to other kings of England, ancestors to this King Edward. At the solemnity of this coronation there were let go to libertie (catch them that catch might) five hundred great horses by the king of Scots, the earles of Cornwall, Gloucester, Pembroke, Warren, and others, as they were allighted from their backs."

EDWARD II.

Edward II. and his queen were crowned at Westminster on the 24th February. Holinshed informs us. "There was such presse and throng at this coronation, that a knight, called Sir John Blakewell, was thrust or crowded to death." The bishops also were incommoded, and forced to hurry through the service in a slovenly manner; and yet it was not concluded before three in the afternoon.

EDWARD III.

A remarkable coronation medal was struck on this occasion: on one side the young prince was represented crowned, laying his sceptre on a heap of hearts, with the motto "Populo dat juramentum" (He gives laws to a willing people); and on the other was a hand held out to save a falling crown, with the motto, "Non rapit, sed recipit." (He seizes not, but receives.)

RICHARD II.

The coronation of this king was more magnificent than any of the preceding. The procession of the king from the Tower to Westminster, on the day preceding the coronation, is thus described by Holinshed:—"The citie was adorned in all sorts most richlie. The water-conduits ran with wine for the space of three hours to-

gether. In the upper end of Cheape was a certain castell, made with foure towers; out of which castell, on two sides of it, ran forth wine abundantly. In the towers were placed foure beautiful virgins, of stature and age like to the king, apparelled in white vestures, in every tower one, the which blew in the king's face at his approaching neere em, leaves of gold; and as he approached also, they threw on him and his horse counterfeit florens of gold.

HENRY IV.

Henry IV. was crowned by archbishop Fitzalan on the 13th of October, 1399, and on this occasion the ampulla was first employed. After Henry had gone to the Tower he created forty-six knights of the Bath, among whom were three of his own sons. The procession from the Tower to Westminster was unusually splendid, no less than six thousand horses having been employed on the occasion.

THE BENTINCK COUNCIL.

Met as a Court of Revision at Allan Park on the 25th May, 1897, Mr. Dickson, chairman.

The following appeals were heard, viz:—John Wilson, lot 2, con. 6, assessment reduced \$10; John Noble, lot 19, con. 2, N. D. R., reduced \$100; Thomas McGin, lot pt. of 1 of 28, con. 1, W. G. R., reduced \$100; Fred Weidendorf, Hanover, reduced \$50; John N. Smith, lot 28 and 27, con. 2, N. D. R., reduced \$100; J. W. Crawford, mill property, reduced \$50; Scarfe Brothers, lots 1 and 3 of 16, con. 1, and lots 46 and 47, con. 3, N. D. R., reduced \$200; John K. Schmidt, lots 31 and 32, con. 3, N. D. R., reduced \$100; Thomas Stewart, lot 16, con. 2, W. G. R., reduced \$150; Duncan McArthur, lot 17 and 18, con. 2, W. G. R., reduced \$100.

All the appeals having been disposed of Court adjourned and Council met for general business. Minutes of February meeting read and passed.

The assessment roll was ordered to be received from the assessor and his salary of \$75 paid him.

Petition from John A. Grant and 32 others received asking Council to open the 14th con., between lots 12 and 15—request granted.

Petition from R. J. W. Fisher and 19 others asking for a change of Path master in Elmwood—not granted.

The following accounts were ordered to be paid:—John Walker, \$5.00 for culvert on S. L. 15, con. 14; Henry Smith, \$2.00 for balance on work in June, 1895; Registrar South Grey, \$1.05 for teachers' re deviations; Wm. Pepper, 38c for plank on bridge, con. 12, lot 1; Herman Kemkes, \$3.00, half cost of putting stone in town line bridge, B. and E.; John Rutherford & Sons, \$12.47 for township stationery.

The following grants were made to indigents:—James Smith, \$8.00; Mrs. Finnetry, \$8.00; Mrs. Naller, \$5.00; John Pyke, \$11.00; Dan McPailand, \$5.00.

The treasurer was authorized to borrow money to meet the Hanover statute labor accounts. Messrs. Leslie and Devlin were appointed a committee to examine S. L. 15, con. 14 and report.

Messrs. Adlam and Brown were appointed a committee to examine into the best means of getting a road for Duncan McArthur and report.

The county treasurer was instructed to erase the arrears of taxes against north part lot 22 con. 12.

It was ordered that not more than 5c per load or 8c per yard be paid by pathmasters for gravel and all gravel carts, to be handed to the clerk not later than 1st October.

The following grants on roads were made:—\$50 on townline Normanby and Bentinck; \$50 on sink hole con. 2 and 3, S. D. R.; \$50 McTavish's bridge; \$100 to open con. 14 at lots 12, 13, and 14; \$70 in Hanover; \$30 in Elmwood; and \$150 set apart for gravel.

By-law No. 4 allowing Messrs. Kilmer, Crawford and McIntyre to put up electric light poles on S. L. 40 W. G. R. was read and passed.

Council adjourned to meet at Dornoch on Monday the 2nd August next.
