Many curious instances of the spread of foreign customs and the absorption of European ideas are found in the English and vernacular newspapers of China. Reforms are adopted very slowly in China. The law remains as it was one thousand years ago, and all the customs that pertain to the worship of ancestors and the upholding of paternal authority cannot be altered by so much as a hair's breadth, without provoking a storm of protest which not even the highest authority

could afford to ignore. A case illustrating the remarkable hold that superstition has even on persons of wealth and intelligence, comes from a place south of Canton. It seems that the persistent ill-fortune of a respectable family of some wealth was traced to the fact that they had selected an "unpropitious" site for the burial of the bones of the head of the house. The Chinese custom is to exhume the coffin after three years, and to wash the bones and put them in a large jar. This jar is then buried in a shady place, usu-
