FIRE SERVICE IN NORWAY.

The Various Duties of the Fire Laddies and Their Rate of Pay.

Capt. R. W. Henderson gives some instructive details of fire service in Norway. The firemen enter the service at 22 years of age, none being accepted under that age or beyond 30. They are taken on as probationers, from which grade they rise to be permanent firemen. A preference is given to mechanics, who, when not on fire duty, are engaged in making the hose, carts, ladders and other apparatus required in the service. There is generally high water pressure to be had, but where engines are needed, they are usually of English make. The telegraph and telephone wires, the water mains and sewers, are all under the care of the firemen, who, notwithstanding their many and various duties, are always ready to turn out for service. Their pay is very small-from about \$4.50 to \$6.50 a week, with quarters, and an allowance of about \$28 for uniform. The uniform consists of a dark blue serge shirt, dark navy-blue trousers, stout high and low shoes, and a strong woolen belt, with hook, axe, etc., and a leather he'met. The engines are drawn by sturdy little Norwegian horses, and they do smart work in getting to the fire, notwithstanding the heavy loads they have to haul through the roughly paved streets. The firemen are well drilled and disciplined, and are thoroughly ed and disciplined, and are thoroughly efficient. 
