1. If any person orders his paper discon singed, he must pay all arreages, or the publisher may continue to send it until pay mentis made, and collect the whole amount whether it be taken from the office or not There can be no legal discontinuance unti paymentismade.

2. Any person who takes a paper from the post office, whether directed to his pame or another, or whether he has sub scribed or not is responsible for the pay.

3. If a subscriber orders his paper to be stopped at a certain time, and the published continues to send, the subscriber is bound to pay for it if he takes it out of the pos office. This proceeds upon he ground hat a man must pay for what he uses.
