EDUCATE or DIE!

HERE are the young men of today who will be the Lutheran pastors of tomorrow? . . . They are in our Lutheran Colleges. studying, learning and growing, to prepare for the spiritual leadership ahead of them.

Suppose we had no Lutheran Colleges; where would they be? Nowhere; there would be practically no Lutheran pastors for the future.

Ninety-two per cent, of all the educated men in the Christian ministry have been educated in the colleges of their own denomination, 9 of every 10 educated Baptist ministers come from Baptist colleges; 9 of

every 10 educated Anglican ministers come from Anglican colleges; 9 of every 10 educated Lutheran ministers come from Lutheran colleges, and so on in every denomination.

Each Church body must educate its own ministers or go without educated ministers. We must "educate or die."

A Church body which ignores or evades its duty to educate, sooner or later drops out of the service of the Master. Look back over the history of the Christian Church and see the fate of

the sects that refused to build colleges; they have all died the death of the "hard-shell."

It costs a Church to build a College, but it costs tremendously more not to build it


