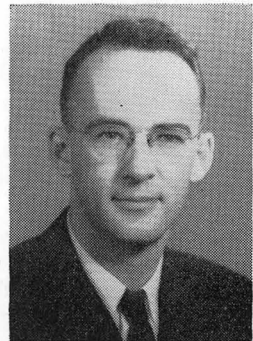
For the past eighteen years, he has been Public Relations and Advertising Manager of the B. F. Goodrich Rubber Company of Canada, Limited.

Other degrees include the Bachelor of Divinity degree from the Lutheran Theological Seminary at Gettysburg, Pa., in 1944, and the Doctor of Philosophy degree awarded by the University of Chicago through the Divinity School in 1949.

Rev. Bream has served as assistant pastor of Woodlawn-Immanuel Lutheran Church, Chicago (1944-1948), and as pastor of Zion Lutheran Church, Trinidad, Colorado (1949-1953). He is married, and has four children.
