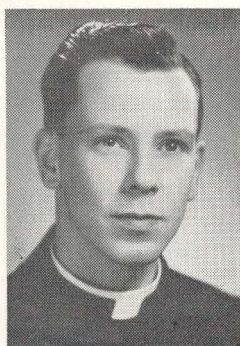
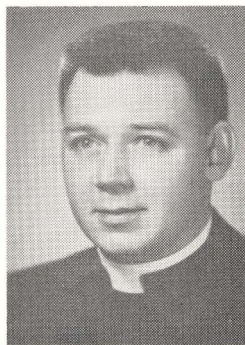
1. Abide with us, our Saviour,
