EDUCATION FOR FREEDOM

Culture is not enough. Greece experienced an unusually high degree of culture, but Greece fell.

Legislation is not enough. Rome had its great laws, studied even in modern law schools, but the Roman Empire fell.

Technical training is not enough. Germany had its outstanding technicians, but they could not prevent the tragic experiences of recent years.
