WLU Student wins \$5,000 Fellowship.

One of 4 Offered in Ontario and Quebec

Robert Peter Głofcheski, a fourth-year honors economics and mathematics student at Wilfrid Laurier University, has been awarded a \$5,000 Bell Canada Fellowship. It is one of only four awarded each year to students from all Ontario and Quebec universities.

The award, one of the largest to go to a WLU student in recent years, is based purely on academic achievement and is open to students in all subject areas in the two provinces.

Given by Bell Canada, the fellowship recognizes the country's need for highly trained, professionally qualified men and women in every field of endeavor. Winners are selected by the Association of Universities and Colleges of Canada.

The award, which holds the possibility of renewal, allows Mr. Głofcheski to accept an additional \$1,000 in scholarships offered by the University of Western Ontario where he will work toward a master's degree in economics next fall.

In his years at WLU, the award winner held the Ontario Scholarship, the WLU Faculty-Board Scholarship, the Alumni Scholarship and a \$1,000 Brent Scholarship.
