Rev. Dr. Delton Glebe Named to 2nd Term
as Head of Waterloo Lutheran Seminary

Rev. Dr. Delton Glebe of Waterloo has been named to a second five-year term as principal and dean of Waterloo Lutheran Seminary.

Dr. Glebe has taught at the seminary since his graduation in 1950, first as a part-time lecturer and full time since 1961. He was a pastor at New Dundee and Mannheim and mission developer and pastor of Mount Zion Lutheran Church, Waterloo.

In addition, Dr. Glebe was chairman of the board of governors of Waterloo College, the forerunner to the present university, when it achieved its independent university charter in 1959.

Dr. Glebe completed his work for the M.A. degree in counselling at Boston University in 1959 and received his doctorate in theology and counselling at Knox College, University of Toronto, 1970.

He is a member of the consultation committee on theological education for the Lutheran Church in America and serves on the joint commission on Inter-Lutheran relations in Canada, the group attempting formation of an all-Canadian Lutheran church.

In addition, he is a member of the certification committee of the Canadian Association for Pastoral Education and an advisory member of the committee on professional leadership for the Eastern Canada Synod of the Lutheran Church in America.
