<u>Three part TV series on aging</u> produced by professors at WLU

A three-part television series for those nearing or in retirement, titled: Aging--problems and possibilities, has been prepared by faculty members at Wilfrid Laurier University.

The series will be seen on Grand River cable television beginning this Thursday, Nov. 18, at 7:30 p.m. and at the same time on the following two Thursday evenings. Programs are repeated the day following at 3:30 p.m.

Dr. Brant Bonner, professor-emeritus of business, discusses job opportunities overseas for retired volunteers in the first program. Dr. Bonner has just returned from a teaching assignment in Ghana.

On Nov. 25 Prof. Barbara Cowan, a member of the WLU social work faculty, looks at some of the social problems facing retirees. The final discussion, with Prof. Ralph Blackmore, a WLU economist, delves into financial realities for older persons.
