(The Congregation shall stand except for the reading of the Epistle, the announcements, the Sermon, and the gathering of the Offering)

THE PROCESSIONAL HYMN

1. O worship the King, all glorious above,
O gratefully sing his wonderful love;
Our shield and defender, the Ancient of
Days,
Pavilioned in splendour, and girded with
praise.

Whose robe is the light, whose canopy
space;

storm.

Almighty, thy power had founded of old;
Hath established it fast by a changeless
decree,
And round it hath cast, like a mantle, the
sea.

It breathes in the air, it shines in the light;
It streams from the hills, it descends to the
plain,
And sweetly distils in the dew and the rain.

In thee do we trust, nor find thee to fail;

Our Maker, Defender, Redeemer, and

Response: Lord have mercy.

For this university, and for them that in faithfulness offer here the worship of their service and labour, let us pray to the Lord.

Response: Lord have mercy.

For this graduating class, and for all who are receiving recognition among us for work well done, let us pray to the Lord.

Response: Lord have mercy.

Help, save, pity and defend us, O God, by thy grace.
