Top footballers to share secrets
at WLU's football clinic May 11-12

More than 150 high school football coaches are expected to attend the 11th annual football clinic May 11 and 12 at Wilfrid Laurier University.

The two-day clinic, which brings some of North America's top coaches to campus, is one of Canada's largest clinics for high school coaches.

Dave (Tuffy) Knight, director of athletics at WLU and coach of its famed Golden Hawks football team, is clinic coordinator.

The event begins at 6:15 p.m. May 11 when Bill McTeer of Laurier will discuss defensive secondary play. Then Tony Mason of the University of Arizona talks about motivation and discipline and coaching coaches.

The night ends with a coaches corner at 10 p.m. when those attending can mingle with guest coaches and talk about mutual concerns and interests. There will also be a number of equipment displays.

The clinic continues the next day, beginning at 9 a.m., when Doug Hargreaves of Queen's University, current College Bowl champs, will discuss the Queen's offense. Then Jack Gotta of the Calgary Stampeders will speak on developing a pass-receiver.

After lunch, Rich Newbrough of the WLU Golden Hawks will talk about pass route combinations for split ends and slot-backs. Cal Stoll will discuss developing an off-season attitude.
