

Rev. J. Ray Houser, M.A., D.D.

The Rev. J. Ray Houser was born near Greensburg, Pennsylvania. Upon graduation from High School he taught in the public schools. In 1921 he graduated from Gettysburg College. While in college he taught in Gettysburg Academy. In 1924 he araduated from the Philadelphia Lutheran Seminary and remained at the Seminary for two years as an Instructor. In 1926 he accepted a call to a parish near the Seminary in order to continue graduate studies at both the Seminary and the University of Pennsylvania. In 1927 he was awarded the Master of Arts Degree by the University and the B.D. Degree

by the Seminary. He was called to St. Mark's Church, Williamsport, Pa., where over a period of twenty-five years he developed in mid-city a congregation with 2400 souls and a staff of eight persons. He has served on many Church Boards in two Pennsylvania Synods, on the Board of Social Missions of the United Lutheran Church, and on the Board of Directors of the Pennsylvania Council of Churches.

His brother, Dr. Donald L. Houser, Chicago, Illinois, is a Secretary of the Board of American Missions of the United Lutheran Church; his son, J. Ray, Jr., is a Mission Pastor at Ohio View in the Pittsburg Synod; his daughter, Ardath E., is a teacher in the Williamsport High School; another son, Luther D., is associated with Standard Oil of N. J. With him in Waterloo at 284 Albert St. N. are his wife, Gertrude D., whose brother is a Lutheran Pastor in the Maryland Synod, and his daughter, Della Marian, a student in MacGregor School.
