Fonthill and Waterloo students
named to WLU board of governors

One of the results of the student activism of the 1960s was the naming of students to the governing boards of Ontario universities.

Wilfrid Laurier University was one of the first universities to name students to the board of governors, as well as electing students to the various department committees and other positions of authority.

Two students recently named to the board of governors were:

Jacqueline Cook of Fonthill, Ont., a third-year student in the co-op honors business program and Bala Naidoo of Waterloo, a fourth-year honors business student.

Miss Cook will be serving a two-year term and Mr. Naidoo will be serving a one year term.

Tom Ramautarsingh, a Georgetown high school teacher, was re-elected as one of the three alumni on the university board.
